Welcome to the U.S. Premiere of *Fame Forever, Reunion and Rebirth* - the long awaited sequel to David De Silva's Academy Award-winning motion picture, long-running television series and popular musical, *FAME! Fame Forever, Reunion and Rebirth* warps through twenty years revealing the fate of the original musical's characters, now all grown up, and their children who are now students at the New York's famed "High School for Performing Arts," the Fiorello H. LaGuardia High School of Music & Art and Performing Arts.

Conceived by De Silva, fondly known to thousands of young, hopeful actors as "Father Fame", with book and lyrics by Ben Winter and music by Steve Margoshes, *Fame Forever* received its World Premiere on May 3rd, 2007 in Glasgow, Scotland at the King's Theatre by The Apollo Players. Directed by John Carlyle, the production received a total of seven performances, including two preview nights. And while production elements (both technical and structural) were still being worked out right up until the show's gala premiere opening, the show received an enthusiastically warm

reception from both preview and opening night audiences alike.

Fame Forever's show structure and musical architecture is cinematic both in form and function. Told in very broad brush strokes, the musical covers a time span of 30+ years and follows numerous character storylines. Stylistically, this framework aptly supports the show's themes of 'Rebirth and Renewal' by creating a sense of time passing – rather quickly. There's a lesson to learn from this story – no matter how hard we try to hold onto the past, tomorrow inevitably comes. By the show's end, we should come to understand the connectivity of ourselves with each other and the world around us by 'connecting our past with our future'.
