Reluctantly, they are pulled apart to their impending births. They vow to meet again in this very place in 27 years.

Chamonix seems forgotten as they experience the joys of growing up. Julie and Colin succumb to life's physical attractions. She marries. He becomes engaged. Although they seem contented, each is haunted by an unexplainable longing. Chamonix calls.

It is 27 years later, when Colin and Julie, unbeknownst to each other, answer the call. Both are drawn to the snowcapped Mont Blanc and the valley below. They meet and quickly fall under the spell of their soul's attraction. They revel in the ecstasy of this seemingly new found love and plan to meet that night and dance to their favorite waltz. But before they can come together again, fate steps in. In a synchronistic moment of time, death claims them both. He dies in a skiing accident, she in an auto crash.

Back in the cosmic space of their first meeting, Colin and Julie dance the Chamonix Waltz. No longer are they bound to life. The miracle of their union is eternal. "This is Forever".
